WARREN HIGH SCHOOL BAND BOOSTERS MEETING
Monday, October 8th, 2007

Secretary's report from September was read and approved.

Treasurer Mrs. McGrew reported that the checking account has \$35,294.43, bingo account has \$17,702.17, truck account has \$8,648.10 and \$15,000 in CDs. The truck note payable is \$25,990. Total band funds are \$50,648.46. We are waiting to consolidate the accounts until the CD's mature.

Mrs. Powell reported that the Barlow Fair Fundraiser went well. She thanked the parents and students that worked extra shifts to fill some of the spots. Mrs. Hamilton reported that we made \$5,627.84

Mr. George reported that Irvine's Camper Sales will donate the awning for the big trailer, provided that one of the two he has fits.

Fundraising Committee - Mrs. Hayes reported that the Rada Fundraiser is now over, but she will be accepting orders through October 11th. So far we have made a \$1,500 profit. Mrs. Joyce reported that the "That's My Pan" fundraiser will start on the 15th and she will drop off the forms for the students on the 15th. For every 50 pans we sell, we get a credit of \$25.

Mrs. King reported on the Craft Fair and mentioned that we have all the vendors lined up. There is a meeting schedule for October 16th at 5:30pm in the band room for those interested in helping or learning more. Mrs. McGrew mentioned that we need someone to chair the parking and we need lots of help for setup, tear down, and kitchen. Mrs. King also mentioned that a teacher wanted to sell cheerleading uniforms at the fair, it was decided that it would be in the best interest of the craft fair to not allow anything but home made crafts to be sold. Mrs. King will ask the teacher to contact BV and see if she can setup under the canopy and sell the uniforms there. Mrs. King also asked for someone to shadow her to take over as the craft fair vendor chairperson.

Mrs. Kern reported on the raffle for the tractor. She stated that we have 827 tickets that have been turned in and over 1,500 that are still out. She asked that all tickets that have been sold need to be turned in immediately. She also asked that if you do not plan on selling anymore tickets, to please turn in the extras so we can sell them at the craft fair. She needs all tickets turned in no later than October 27th.

Mrs. Foster reported that everything is all set for the BOA Grand Nationals. She is waiting on the schedule for the IMAX before she can send out the agenda to parents. There will be a BOA Chaperone meeting on October 22nd at 6:30pm in the band room for the 18 parents that are chaperoning the trip.

Mr. Foster reported that the Youngstown trip went very well, kids did a great job at the performance. He also stated that we need to find a place to feed the kids in Cambridge between the two competitions on the 13th around 5pm. On the 20th, the kids will be performing at the Marietta College Homecoming Parade and Football game, and then go on to the Belpre Competition. We need to feed the kids between these two events as well. Mr. Foster mentioned that we can return to the high school and maybe have a pot luck dinner or subway.

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He also reported that the band will not be going to the Gallia Football Game since it is the furthest away game and Mr. Jugler and Mrs. Powell spoke with Mr. Leffingwell and he ok'd the band not traveling to far away games do to finances.
